WELCOME TO BELEAST CATHEDRAL

On Friday 6th September, we celebrated the 120th anniversary of laying the foundation stone of Belfast Cathedral on a warm and sunny day in September 1899.

Throughout the history of Belfast Cathedral there has been a succession of distinguished Organists, choirs and choristers. On Sunday 8th September, 2019 a new chapter in the history of our cathedral and its choir began. We welcome Mr Matthew Owens as our new Director of Music and Mr William Forrest as our new Organ Scholar. In October the cathedral choir of Lay Clerks and Choral Scholars, will lead Choral Evensong on Thursday and Friday evenings, starting each night at 5.30pm. There will be said Evening Prayer on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday nights.

From 2020, the Cathedral Choir will have a new combined top line of boy and girl choristers. This will make us one of the few cathedrals in the UK to feature a single top line that equally combines the talents of boys and girls. Building on our existing choristers, Mr Owens will be recruiting and training additional choristers throughout the Autumn term. While the new choristers are being trained we thank our Soprano top line which will sing on Sundays at the 11.00am Choral Eucharist and at 3.30pm Choral Evensong.

On the pages that follow you will be introduced to a full, new, and exciting programme of service music for the month of September, as our new Director of Music leads us forward.

It is my hope and prayer that you will support him, our choir, and organists by your attendance at weekday evensongs, and Sunday choral services.

ABOUT BELEAST CATHEDRAL

Belfast Cathedral, (the Cathedral Church of St Anne) is a Cathedral of the Church of Ireland, and part of the worldwide Anglican Communion (Episcopalian). It is unusual in serving two separate dioceses, Connor and Down & Dromore, and so has not one, but two, Bishop's Seats.

The Cathedral has stood for 120 years as a place of Christian worship in the heart of the City of Belfast. Featuring the 56-metre stainless steel *Spire of Hope* (added in 2007), detailed mosaics by the sisters Gertrude and Margaret Martin, elaborately carved stonework by sculptors Rosamond Praeger, Morris Harding, and Esmond Burton, and beautiful stained glass windows, this Hiberno-Romanesque building is one of the ecclesiastical and architectural highlights of Northern Ireland.

The splendid acoustic of the Cathedral is the setting for the 4-manual Harrison & Harrison organ, a Wells-Kennedy chamber organ, and a 2 manual organ by the renowned Dutch firm, Klop. The Cathedral Choir includes professional lay clerks, choral scholars, boy choristers, and girl choristers. As well as Sunday Services and weekday Choral Evensongs, there are large diocesan and civic occasions. Over the years the Cathedral choirs have sung on national and local radio and television, and have undertaken concerts and tours.

Belfast Cathedral sits at the heart of The Cathedral Quarter, which is known for its unique and artisan shops, wide variety of restaurants, and buzzing nightlife, close to the Titanic Quarter and the city centre itself.

The clergy, staff, congregation, and volunteers of Belfast Cathedral look forward to offering you a warm welcome.
