

Belfast Cathedral (the Cathedral Church of St Anne) has stood for over 100 years as a place of Christian worship in the heart of the City of Belfast. Featuring the 40-metre stainless steel *Spire of Hope* (added in 2007), detailed mosaics, elaborately carved stonework, and beautiful stained glass windows, this Hiberno-Romanesque building is one of the ecclesiastical and architectural highlights of Northern Ireland.


